

Premise History Form for Emergencies

If there is an emergency, I may need to call 911. They can send the police, the fire department, or an ambulance to me if I need it.



It is important for 911 staff to know as much as possible about me, my family, and the situation.



I may be scared or anxious and forget important information to share when I call 911.



I can fill out a Premise History Form before I have an emergency.



I can contact my local police or county dispatch and ask for a Premise History Form.



If my county doesn't have its own form, I can download a Premise History Form online.

I can include my name, address, and age in the Premise History Form.

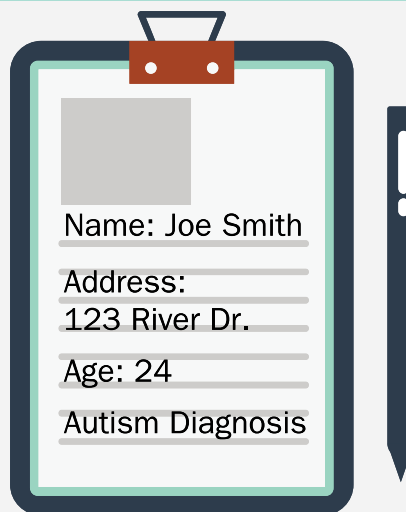

I can also share how I communicate, any sensory sensitivities, and what keeps me calm.



This information helps police, the fire department, or other first responders know how to help me when there is an emergency.



Once I complete the Premise History Form, I can mail or take it to my local police department or county dispatch center so they have my information.



I need to keep my Premise History Form updated. Some counties ask for new forms every few years. Having this information will help keep me safe in an emergency.
