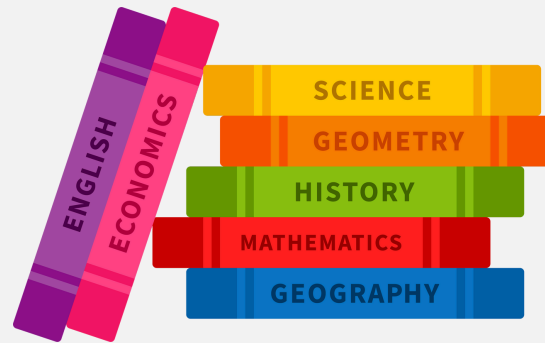


Choosing a Major and Classes in College

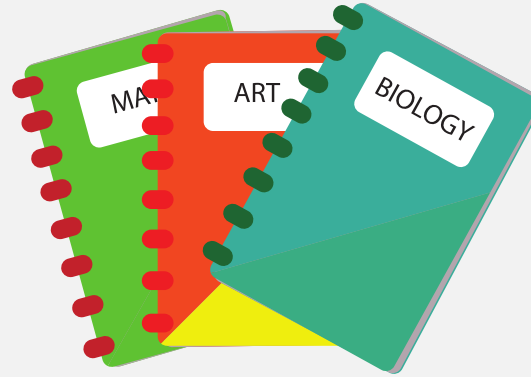
